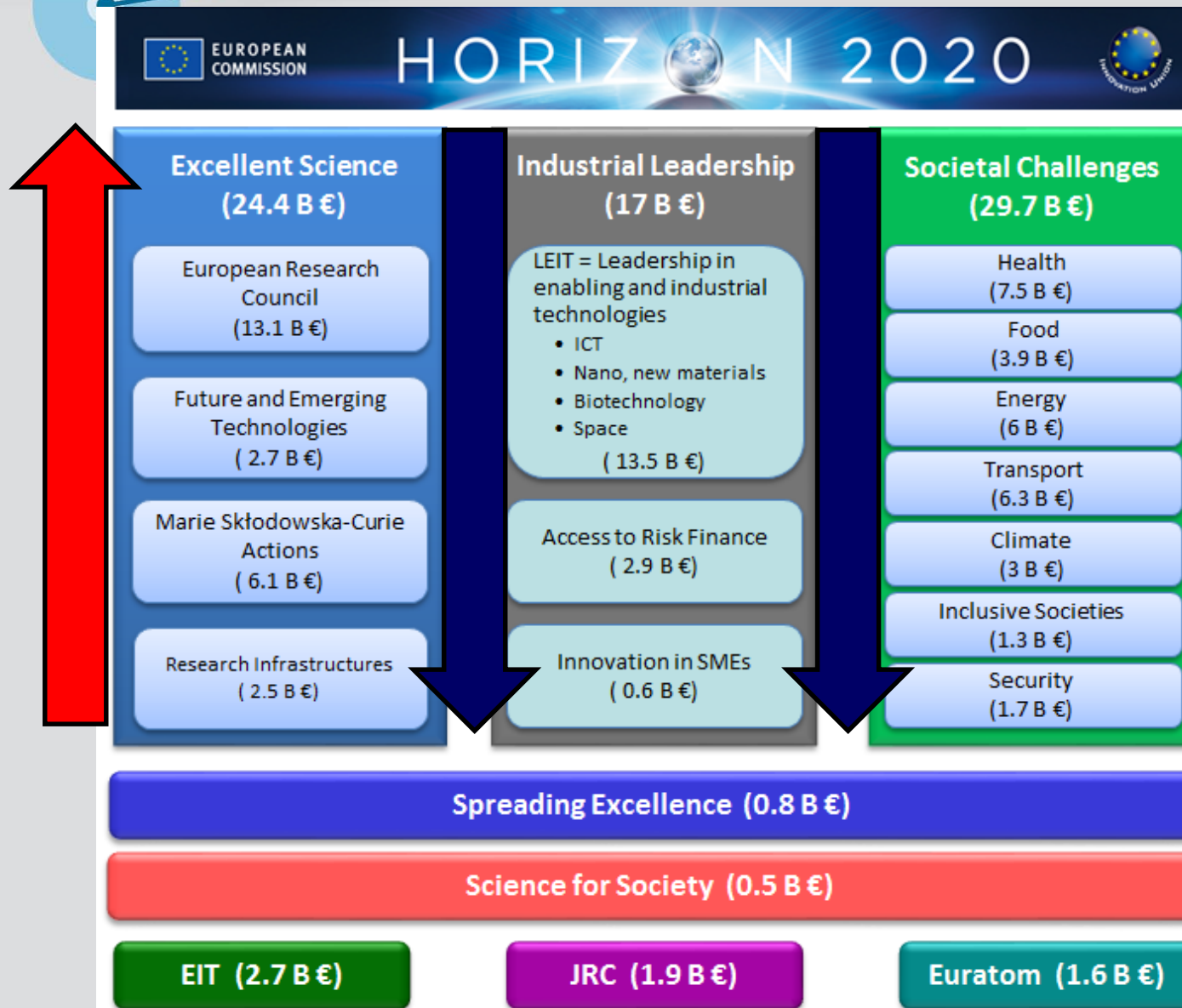

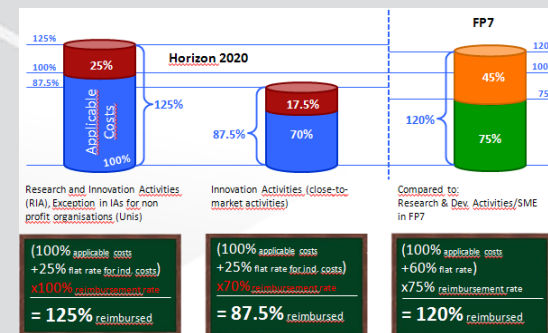


## SINGLE SET OF RULES for Horizon 2020

- Adapted for the whole research & innovation cycle
- Covering all research programmes & funding bodies
- Aligned to the Financial Regulation, coherent with other new EU Programmes.

### 1. One funding rate.

**Maximum of 100% of direct costs** (except for actions close to market, max.70% will apply)  
**+ 25% of direct eligible costs** (= Indirect eligible costs)

## H2020: Example of topic

**PHC 3 - 2015: Understanding common mechanisms of diseases and their relevance in co-morbidities**

Specific challenge. The development of new treatments is greatly facilitated by an improved understanding of the pathophysiology of diseases. There is therefore a need to address the current knowledge gaps in disease aetiology in order to support innovation in the development of evidence-based treatments. In this context, a better understanding of the mechanisms that are common to several diseases, in particular of those leading to co-morbidities, constitutes an important challenge.

Scope: Proposals should focus on the integration of pre-clinical and clinical studies for the identification of mechanisms common to several diseases. Proposals should assess and validate the relevance of these common mechanisms and of their biomarkers (where relevant) on the development of disease-specific pathophysiology, as well as their role in the development of co-morbidities in both males and females.

The Commission considers that proposals requesting a contribution from the EU of between EUR 4 and 6 million would allow this specific challenge to be addressed appropriately. Nonetheless, this does not preclude submission and selection of proposals requesting other amounts.

## H2020: Example of topic

Expected impact: This should provide:

- A better understanding of disease pathways and / or mechanisms common to a number of diseases
- New directions for clinical research for better disease prevention, health promotion, therapy development, and the management of co-morbidities

### Topic Description

#### Specific Challenge:

The activity aims at developing and validating radically new ICT based concepts and approaches for empowering and motivating people in need of guidance and care due to age related conditions, in cooperation with their carers where relevant, and to help them improve and maintain their independence, functional capacity, health status as well as preserving their physical, cognitive, mental and social well-being.

#### Scope:

Proposals should develop a proof of concept of radically new solutions for a personalised "virtual coach", building upon intelligent ICT environments, access to relevant physiological and behavioural data, new forms of accessible interaction based on tangible user interaction concepts, open platforms and emotional computing. Usability and ease of user interaction should be essential design elements of the "coach".

The "coach" should provide personalised advice, guidance and follow-up for key age related issues in daily life which impact the person's ability to remain active and independent, for example diet, physical activity, risk avoidance, preventive measures, lifestyle and activity management, leisure, social participation and overall wellness. The goal should be to preserve physical, cognitive, mental and social well-being for as long as possible and to facilitate interaction with carers (where relevant).

Solutions should build on and apply multi-disciplinary research and include intelligent algorithms beyond state-of-the-art capable of reasoning, autonomous learning and adaptation to personal needs, emotional and behavioural patterns, conditions and preferences as well as the users' living environment and their social connections. Solutions should be integrated seamlessly in existing every-day activities and provide desired information in fast and efficient manner. Attention theft by ICT (consuming too much of the user's time) should be avoided.

Proposals should address relevant ethics and gender aspects and should also assess related legal and regulatory questions such as ownership of data, data protection/privacy, liability and consumer protection. It is crucial that users are involved and drive the innovation at all stages of design and development, including user acceptability, satisfaction and impact in realistic settings.

The Commission considers that proposals requesting a contribution from the EU of between EUR 3 and 4 million would allow this specific challenge to be addressed appropriately. Nonetheless, this does not preclude submission and selection of proposals requesting other amounts.

#### Expected Impact:

The proposal should present methodologies and metrics as appropriate for measuring its progress towards the expected impact in:

- Usefulness and effectiveness of personalized recommendations and follow-up in terms of the goals of preserving physical, cognitive, mental and social well-being for as long as possible;
- Validation of non-obtrusive technology for physical, cognitive, social and mental well-being;
- Evidence of user-centred design and innovation, new intuitive ways of human-computer interaction, and user acceptance;
- Potential cost-effectiveness due to enhanced self-care, life-style and care management.

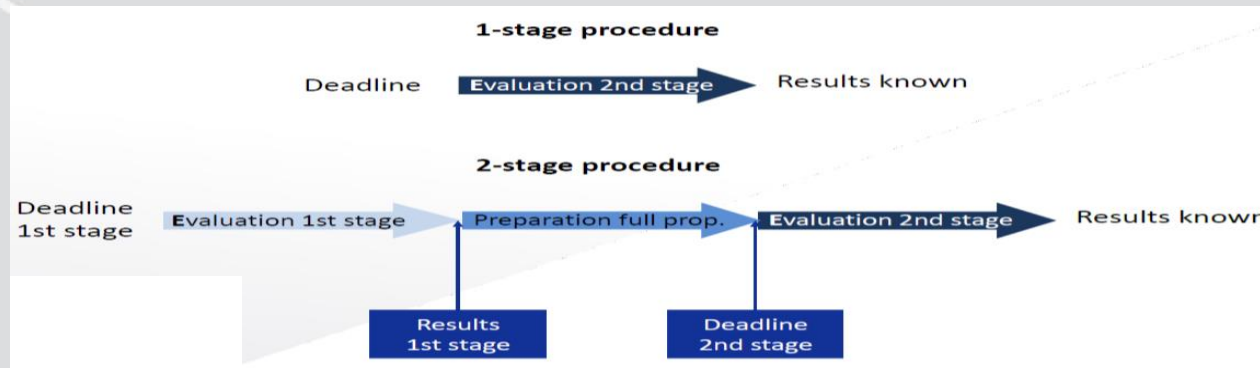

  - Full proposal: max number of pages for Sections 1+2+3 depends of funding instrument: 70 pages for IA & RIA & 50 pages CSA. Section 4 & 5 no page limit
- Two-stage proposals:
  - Short version of proposal is submitted & evaluated: not all criteria are applied at this stage. (Max number of pages for sections 1+ 2 +3 has changed, 7, 15, now mostly 10 pages)
  - If evaluated positively: submission full second stage proposal & evaluated against all the 3 criteria.

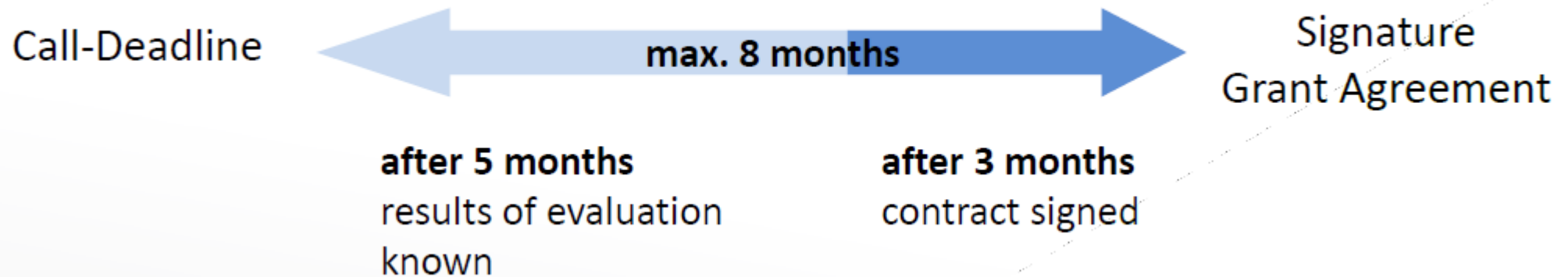
## H2020 Proposal Evaluation

- **Evaluation criteria scored out of 5 (0.5 points allowed)**
  - **0** - The proposal fails to address the criterion under examination or cannot be judged due to missing or incomplete information = **INELIGIBLE**
  - **1 = Poor** - The criterion is unadequately addressed or there are serious inherent weaknesses
  - **2 = Fair** - The proposal broadly addresses the criterion but there are significant weaknesses
  - **3 = Good** - the proposal addresses the criterion well but a number of shortcomings are present
  - **4 = Very Good** - The proposal addresses the criterion very well but a small number of shortcomings are present
  - **5 = Excellent** - The proposal successfully addresses all relevant aspects of the criterion in question. Any shortcomings are minor.

## H2020 Proposal Evaluation

- At least 3 experts (evaluators) per full proposal (often 5 or more)
- Experts in Ethical issues
- Independent Observers of the H2020 evaluation procedure
- Only first-stage proposals that are evaluated positively are invited to submit full proposal
- If below “individual” or “total-proposal” threshold, evaluation procedure stop and proposal is not retained for funding.
- Evaluation procedure at least 3 phases
  - «Individual evaluation»
  - «Consensus group»
  - «Panel review»

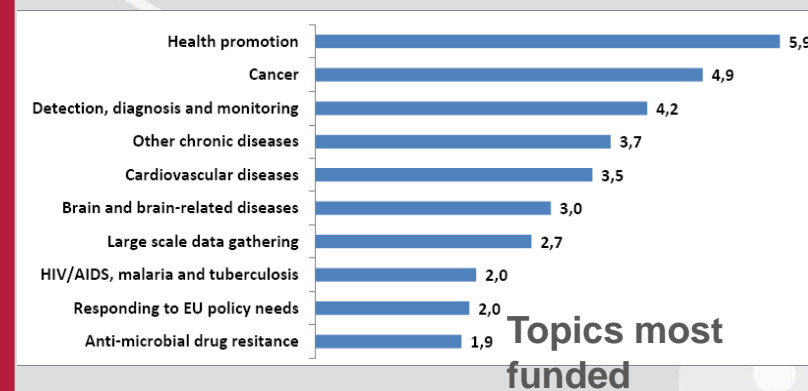
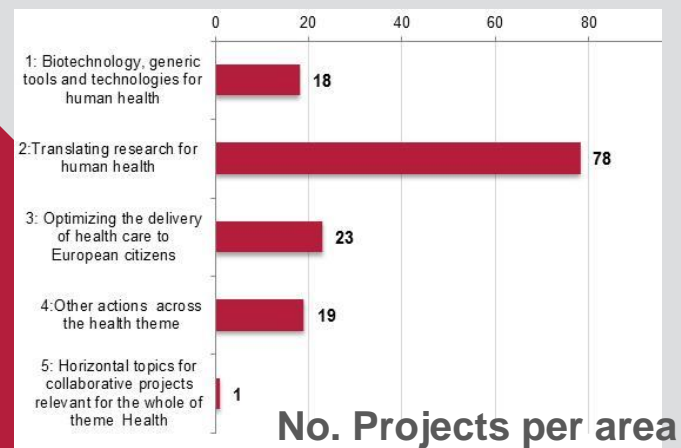

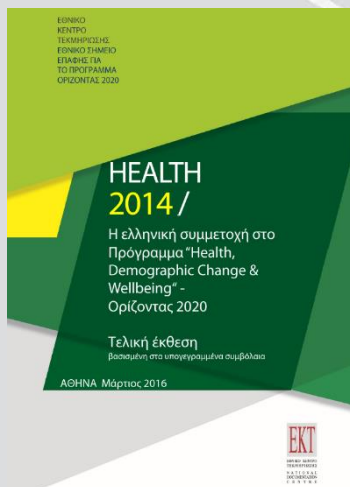

## Greek Participation in H2020-SC1 2014 & 2015



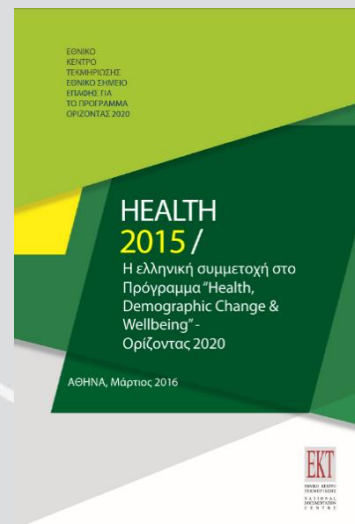

- Write for the evaluators (against evaluation criteria)
- Proposal has to be “self-contained”
- Take care of details / good presentation: the difference between winning & losing can be 0,5 points
- Write a good abstract: first impression counts

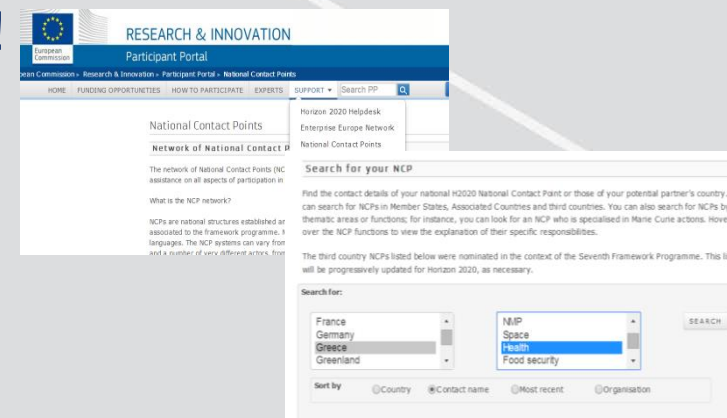
