




BRIEF HISTORY


- In 2005, a letter signed by French President Jacques Chirac and five other heads of state asked European Union officials to support the development of a European digital library
- Europeana prototype went live on 20 Nov 2008 (4.5 million objects)
- In January 2011, the European Commission released its 'New Renaissance' report which endorsed Europeana as 'the central reference point for Europe's online cultural heritage'.
- In September 2012 Europeana metadata was released under the terms of the Creative Commons CC0 1.0 Universal Public Domain Dedication
- In May 2015, Europeana became one of the European Commission's Digital Service Infrastructures (DSI)



The European Commission envisions a series of interconnected and well-supported data spaces covering a range of sectors that will deliver new data-driven services, to benefit society and the economy.


